BRIEF REPORT

Routine jobs are increasingly getting automated, and the future of work is looking grim for many. Professionals need to focus not just on technical competencies but also on those skills that technology cannot replace, i.e., people skills or soft skills. Soft skills refer to an individual's ability to sense, regulate, and respond constructively to other people's ideas and explore resolutions to issues, challenges, problems or conflicts with others. According to Deloitte Access Economics, soft skill-intensive occupations are expected to account for two-thirds of all jobs by 2030. Harvard Business Review mentions that while some tasks at work will be automated in the current era of automation, soft skills, or the intangible competencies that people can do well, will be difficult to automate and keep you relevant and required in the current technological era.

Against this backdrop, the **Centre for Communication Soft Skills and Personality Development** organized a special session on sensitizing students to the What, Why and How of Soft Skills for Industry Readiness.

Mr. Abhishek Arora addressed the students and delivered an engaging talk on the subject- Soft Skills for Industry Readiness on 7/01/2023 from 12 noon onward in LT 9. Different soft skills, including time management, empathy, self-expression, resilience, agility, collaboration, learnability, verbal communication, written communication, creativity, problem-solving, leadership, negotiation, and technology, were taught to the audiences using different audio-visual pieces that included stills from popular movies and television advertisements.
