Hospital to study the hygiene and systems for disposal of garbage and hospital wastes": On 10/9/17 eleven students of Nirog club actively took part in visit of CHC (Jaisinghpura Khor) to know hygiene and waste management of hospital with our Resident Doctor Dr. Chand Singh Panwar. Their students interact with the Hospital Staff and know about the proper disposal of garbage and Hospital Waste.

#### **Day 10**

Care for the surroundings: Visit to institutions for the poor (orphanages etc.): On 9 September a total of eighteen students from Y17 and Y16 batch (mostly Sankalp club volunteers) and one faculty member from LNMIIT visited Human Life Foundation, a trust for the underprivileged children living in the slum areas of Jagatpura. Mostly these children belong to migrant laborers. We reached the slum area at around 10.30 am in the morning which is located very close to Askhsay Patra temple. We visited the whole slum areas first. Then we went to a small tent where more than forty children were studying. One teacher was teaching those small children in a blackboard. We were greeted very well by these children. Then these children recited some poems and also that which they have learnt like numbers. They all live in the slums with barely minimum facilities. Some children were used to taking drugs but now they have improved. After interacting with them we distributed fruits, (bananas and apple) and sweets to the children. We have also distributed pencils, color pencils to the kids. We have also donated 10 Kg of rice to the authorities of HLF. Finally there was a small cultural programme where both our students as well the slum children danced and sang songs. We all enjoyed the show. Our students have made a good video of the programme. Finally Dr Neogi addressed the some parents of the children and requested their active cooperation in educating their children. Our students also addressed their parents as well as the children. Children as well as their parents were very happy to have our group for around two hours and kept waving their hands when we boarded the

Brief description about the Institution and UBA association Role of your Regional Coordinating Institution in handholding LNM institute of Information Technology, Jaipur joined Unnat Bharat Abhiyan as a participating institute in 2019. This is the first project funded by UBA. LNMIIT has done several activities under the UBA after participating as PI. The regional cooordintor has been a constant support in this project as well as the other activities done by LNMIIT. MNIT jaipur as a regional cooordinator has been very efficient in organizing workshops and running awarness initiatives during the covid19 outbreak.

### Establishing Disinfectant Hut/Tunnel

- Overview: This measure is aimed at containing the virus up to some extent.
- Name of the village(s) where the project activities were carried out (along with contact details of Sarpanch/Village officials): Rupa-ki-Nagal , – Shri Naval Kishore Sharma- 9829567544
- Objectives of the project /Need of the project: To make villagers aware about COVID19 and its adverse health effect, to Training the villagers about hand sanitization and health and hygiene, training them to use and operate the tunnel/hut.
- **Brief Introduction of the Project:** Looking at the COVID-19 outbreak the aim is to make the villagers aware about this current epidemic and let these people use this tunnel for self sanitization.
- Brief plan of activities conducted: Technology, Methodology (more than 150 words): We have come-up with sensor based contactless tunnel for self-sanitization of villagers. Tunnel has two sensors (one at the entrance and other at the exit), one of which activates the tunnel when a person enters and it has five nozzles (two each on right and left side and one on top). The nozzles sprays sanitizer, which helps in sanitizing the villagers without they getting into physical contact of any, exposed material or surface. The second sensor is installed at the exit end, which stops the spraying process. The reason for adding second sensor is to avoid the disinfectant wastage and this helps in stopping the spray without any physical contact once again. The tunnel is made of light aluminium material with pipe wirings inside. The spray machine has a refillable twenty-litre tank to fill the sanitizer and is sufficient to disinfect around nine hundred people in one filling. In order to let the sanitizing hut operational even in case of power cuts, we have made this spray machine operate using a chargeable battery which once charged can operated for nearly eight hours.

- Project Duration: 1 month
- Details of Budget: convergence (if any): Tunnel 20,000/-, Electronic Devices
   Sensors+ Wiring + Switches 20,000/-, Solution (Sanitizer) 10,000/- (for 3 months)
- **Project Deliverables /outcome:** Hardware setup, training program (villagers), (training few youths from the village, who can further provide training to other village residents).
- Role of Institution: The institution played a role in establishing the tunnel and training the villagers regarding the functioning of the tunnel, its maintenance and usage.
- Impact on the village: How many households/population get benefitted?: The disinfectant tunnel/hut will be equipped with sensors/ detectors that will activate a spray from misters when a person enters the hut/tunnel. Awareness among villagers on the current pandemic. Villagers will focus more on health and hygiene. Initial level sanitization done before entering the village.
- Other relevant information: Villagers are well trained on how to use, when to use and when not to use. All the operational details are given well in advance for smoother working of this tunnel.
